- 3. 'In the second decade of the twenty-first century, Shelley's advice to the victims of Peterloo remains as relevant as ever.' Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer.
- 4. 'For Edmund Burke, the French Revolution breaks the world order, but for Thomas Paine, it creates it.' Discuss.
- 5. Mary Wollstonecraft believed that no discourse of rights could be complete unless it included women. Discuss the implications of her intervention for the modern world.
- 6. Examine 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin' as a critique of nineteenth century bourgeois capitalism.
- 7. Did Swinburne's attempt to resist the trivialising of the feminine in the nineteenth century succeed in 'Mater Triumphalis'? Justify your answer.
- 8. 'Man of science or colonising conqueror: who is Ulysses?' Discuss with reference to Tennyson's poem.
