- 3. Critically comment on the politics of anonymity in connection with novel writing in the 18th century. Answer with special reference to Burney's *Evelina*.
- 4. Had Branwell written *Wuthering Heights*, would our perception of the Heathcliff-Catherine relationship in the text change in any way? Justify your answer.
- 5. Would you agree that Elizabeth Gaskell's "defense" of Charlotte Bronte's life predominantly contributed to the creation of a "myth of martyred feminine creativity"? Justify your answer through a close reading of the text.
- 6. (a) Explain the difference between a "scriptor" and an "author" in Barthes' "The Death of the Author".

- (b) Write an essay on the rise of multiple and distinct readerships of fiction in the second half of nineteenth century England.
- 7. "In *Middlemarch*, George Eliot seems to engage in a process of soul-searching, an attempt to define and redefine herself, and to signal to others the changing nature of her understanding of her identity and place in the world." Discuss.
