- 1. Fielding claims that *Joseph Andrews* is a "comic epic-poem in prose." Discuss the novel in light of this definition with particular reference to Fielding's comments on the Ridiculous.
- 2. Comment of the use of the grotesque as a generic category in The Life of Gargantua and of Pantagruel.
- 3. '(W)hen a man is telling a story in the strange way I do mine, he is obliged continually to be going backwards and forwards...and now you see, I am lost myself!' Critically comment on the narrative structure of *Tristram Shandy* in light of this statement.
- 4. Can Balzac's Pere Goriot be read as an attempt to masculinize the 19th century novel?
- 5. Henry James says of *Our Mutual Friend* that "[i]t is hardly too much to say that every character here put before us is a mere bundle of eccentricities, animated by no principle of nature whatever." Discuss this comment with specific references to any two characters in the text.
- 6. "If you could give me some story, now, where the dark woman triumphs, it would restore the balance." says Maggie in *The Mill on the Floss*. Discuss how George Eliot challenges the stereotype of the female heroine in this novel.
- 7. 'Though Ulysses is technically a novel, it transcends genre'. Discuss.
- 8. Can Voices from Chernobyl be considered a novel? Justify you answer.
