- 1. Comment on the politics of the different styles of illustration used by Orijit Sen in *River of Stories* with close reference to the graphic text.
- 2. The complexity of the issues raised by Walcott in *Pantomime* ensures that the play transcends the label of being a "postcolonial rewriting" of *Robinson Crusoe*. Elaborate.
- 3. Rushdie's *Haroun and the Sea of Stories* problematises the idea of postcoloniality not only in its thematic explorations but also in its deployment of intertextual devices. Discuss.
- 4. Write a critical essay on the changing human ecology of the Sunderbans depicted in The Hungry Tide.
- 5. Discuss the ways in which the Native American characters in *Green Grass Running Water* subvert the master narratives of Euro- American culture. Would you term such 'literary resistance' a form of wishfulfillment?
- 6. Comment on the deployment of an ageing unlettered woman as narrator in *Kanthapura*. Does this reflect on the larger pattern of representation of women in the novel?
- 7. Critically analyze how space is politicized in terms of gender and ethnicity in Funny Boy.
- 8. "The white Englishwoman Emily Cartwright draws the reader's attention as much as the black protagonist." What do you think are the reasons for this parallelism in the narrative structure of Cambridge?
- 9. Examine the significance of the Granbois episode (Part Two of Wide Sargasso Sea) in Rhys's revisioning of Jane Eyre.
