Group A

- 1. Discuss anti-realism in modern drama with reference to the plays in your syllabus.
- 2. Do you consider Death of a Salesman to be a tragedy? Give reasons for your answer.
- 3. "In Waiting for Godot, nothing happens twice." Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer.
- 4. Sontag describes photography as "mainly a social rite, a defence against anxiety, and a tool of power". Discuss.

Group B

- 5. Would you agree that for Woolf the essence of the modernist novel inheres in a renewed understanding of gender relationships? Give reasons for your answer with reference to *Mrs Dalloway*.
- 6. Comment on the significance of the ending of the novel A Passage to India is a novel.
- 7. Compare the protagonists' disappointment in 'Araby' and Gabriel's disappointment at Gresham hotel in 'The Dead'.
- 8. Comment critically on the narrator's ambivalent stance in Orwell's 'Shooting an Elephant'.
- 9. Attempt a rereading of any *one* of Baudelaire's poems in the so-called 'Black Venus' cycle following Carters' short story of the same name.

Group C

- 10. Does the title and the epigraph in 'Marina' influence the nature of the spiritual experience described in the poem in different ways? Justify your answer.
- 11. Compare and contrast the treatment of old age in "The Circus Animals' Desertion" and "An Acre of Grass".
- 12. 'Edward Said places Yeats's early poetry in a phase of anti-imperialist resistance generated mainly by poets and visionaries, where the colonized land is recovered through an act of imagination'. Attempt a reading of some of the poems of this phase in the light of the above statement.
- 13. How and why does Plath construct a child's persona in the poem 'Daddy' and 'Disquieting Muses'? How does this shape the emotional structure of these poems?
- 14. 'My winter world, that scarcely breathes that bliss/ Now yields you, with some sighs, our explanation'. Discuss Hopkins's poetry in light of this *envoi* for Robert Bridges.
