GROUP A

- 1. In Conrad's novel, the heart of darkness is equally located in colonised Congo and imperial London. Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer.
- 2. 'Memory is the seamstress, and a capricious one at that'. Comment on the role of memory in the construction of selfhood in Woolf's *Orlando*.
- 3. 'He was in a dark part of the hall gazing up the staircase. A woman was standing near the top of the first flight, in the shadow also'. How does Joyce use visibility/invisibility to illuminate characters (for readers as well as other characters in the story) in 'The Dead'?

GROUP B

- 1. Do you consider Hopkins's concept of the inscape as fundamentally religious or artistic? Give reasons for your answer, with suitable examples from his poetry.
- 2. Can one read Yeats's 'Easter, 1916' and 'The Second Coming' as examples of responses to specific historical moments? Discuss.
- 3. Consider how the figure of Prufrock derives from the idea of the *flaneur*, popularised by the French poet Charles Baudelaire in the mid-19th century.
- 4. Examine, with suitable examples, how Dylan Thomas's poetry brings together elements from the pastoral and the Romantic.

GROUP C

- 1. If you were given a free hand to direct *Waiting for Godot*, how would you direct the play? Would you draw inspiration from any/some of its well-known productions?
- 2. What was the political context in which Miller's *The Crucible* was written? Do you think that the play is still relevant in the twenty-first century?
