- 3. Does *The Masque of Blackness* try to accommodate and assimilate the racial other or use the black superficially as showpieces? Justify your stand, with detailed reference to the genre of the masque.
- 4. Discuss the theme of demonic possession in A Yorkshire Tragedy, showing how it affects the characterization of the Husband.
- 5. Comment on the 'shifting religious identity' of the eponymous hero in Marlowe's *TamburlainePart One and Part Two*. How does Greene's *Selimus* deal with this ambiguity of English/European 'trafficking with the Turk'?
- 6. Examine the Renaissance ideal of kingship that Greene glorifies in Selimus.
- 7. Does Fletcher's *The Island Princess* offer any serious criticism of the European colonial adventures in the Spice Islands or does it simply set the stage for a 'clash of civilizations'? Answer with close reference to the text.
