3. In *The Mill on the Floss*, the Dodsons and the Tullivers are the dramatic embodiments of St. Ogg's essential nature and their oppressive narrowness creates a tension for both readers and characters. Do you agree? Give reasons to support your answer.

- 4. Why do you think Tennyson prefaces the spiritual climax in section 95 of *In Memoriam* with descriptions of solid material reality? Answer with suitable references.
- 5. 'Although the subject of Aurora Leigh is the life and career of a woman-poet, the figure in question is neither necessarily nor always Elizabeth Barrett Browning.' Comment.
- 6. Comment on the significance of the ungendered voice as the speaker of Charlotte Mew's dramatic monologue in *The Farmer's Bride* and *The Changeling*.
- 7. Would you agree that Lippo's self-proclaimed aesthetics insist on 'finding' rather than 'making' meaning? Give reasons for your answer.
- 8. Discuss the nature of the gulf between the Blessed Damozel and her lover, supporting your answer with reference to the text.

- 9. What according to Carlyle are the shortcomings of the British Parliament that led to the Chartist movement? Discuss with illustrations from the text you have read.
- 10. Would you agree that by conflating reason and the will of God, Arnold is alluding to man's native desire to go along with a providential order of the world? Discuss with suitable references to 'Sweetness and Light'.
