- 2. "Literature may be in the process of turning towards lituraterre." Locate and elucidate.
- 3. Why does Lacan describe the subject as a logical assertion in his essay on "Logical Time and the Assertion of Anticipated Certainty"? Illustrate your answer.
- 4. What does Lacan mean by the expression, "Eat your Dasein!"? Why does he describe Dasein as Thyestes's dish par excellence?
- 5. Comment on Hamlet's imaginary and symbolic identifications and the factors responsible for them with reference to Lacan's seminar on *Hamlet*.
- 6. What, according to Lacan, are the overlapping characteristics of the "Atè" in Antigone?
- 7. What is the psychoanalytic significance of the writing-effect in the Japanese tongue? Discuss with reference to Lacan's essay on "Lituraterre."
- 8. Examine Lacan's commentary on Joyce's remark, "The letter! The litter!", with reference to the relevant texts.
