1. a. How did the contemporary secret societies of London affect the literature of the first generation of the Romantics? Illustrate with examples.

- b. Describe the connection between George Dyer, Richard Price and John Thelwall with the Romantics.
- 2. a. Examine the debate between Edmund Burke and Tom Paine in the context of the Romantic movement.

OR

- b. Consider the 'Preface' to Lyrical Ballads as a manifesto of the Romantic Movement.
- 3. Examine the significance of the precursors of the Romantics as part of the process of gradual opening up of the sphere of English poetry to members of non-elite groups.
- 4. In what way do Wordsworth's poems in *Lyrical Ballads*(1798) reflect the radical social issues of his time?
- 5. Attempt an analysis of Coleridge's public lecture titled 'The Plot Discovered'.
- 6. "The Ancient Mariner essentially critiques the Enlightenment culture of reason." Discuss.
- 7. Discuss the role of *The Examiner* in shaping the ideology of the younger Romantics.
- 8. "Keats in the *Hyperion* poems attempts to capture the ideology of a failed revolution." Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer.
- 9. "For Shelley poetry was a means of catalysing socio-political changes." Discuss with reference to the poems in your course.
- 10. Critically examine the 'Dedication' in Byron's Don Juan.
