2. (a) The Greek literary tradition initiated the 'ode' as a popular lyric mode and subsequently it cut across diverse literary traditions and made a permanent imprint on the tradition of European lyric poetry. Discuss with special reference to Pindar, Horace and other later poets.

- (b) Thematic diversity enables us to categorise European sonnets into diverse clusters. Discuss with reference to a chronological survey of the tradition in Europe.
- 3. (a) The sonnet since the 18th century has been a conglomerate of acceptance and rejection of an ancient traditional form. Comment on the validity of the statement with reference to at least four sonneteers that you have studied.

(b) How are residual elements from the 'European' lyric tradition used in the poetry of Yeats? Answer with reference to the poems you have read.
