- 2. In the preface to Joseph Andrews, Henry Fielding labels the novel as a "comic epic in prose." Is it possible to apply the same label to Tom Jones as well? Give reasons for your answer.
- 3. "Ann Radcliffe's tendency to ultimately offer rational explanations for the seemingly supernatural occurrences in *The Mysteries of Udolpho* diminishes the Gothic charisma of the novel." Do you agree with this view? Justify your answer.
- 4. What roles do the following women characters play in Jane Austen's *Persuasion:* (a) Mrs Smith; (b) Sophia Croft; and (c) Louisa Musgrove?
- 5. Write an essay on why Charles Dickens chose to begin *Hard Times* with a scene set in a classroom.
- 6. "In *Middlemarch*, George Eliot offers us a critique of marriage, anatomising its idealistic aspirations as well as its inevitable frustrations." Discuss.
- 7. Comment on the narrative strategies employed by Bram Stoker in *Dracula*. Why do you think he deploys new textual technologies so consistently in the novel?
