- 2. To what extent is Seneca successful in writing a revenge tragedy in *Thyestes*? Validate your answer with suitable textual illustrations.
- 3. With special attention to the career of Edgar, analyse if it is possible to interpret *King Lear*, one of William Shakespeare's greatest tragedies, as a comedy.
- 4. "John Dryden's *All for Love* is not only an atypical heroic tragedy, but also a tragedy fashioned after the Aristotelian tradition." Elucidate.
- 5. How far is it justified to call George Lillo's *The London Merchant* a bourgeois tragedy? Substantiate your answer with close reference to the play.
- 6. "The tragic conflict of Henrik Ibsen's *Ghosts* lies in the emerging sun and the very fact that Oswald Alving cannot really get the sunshine anymore." Comment.
- 7. Assuming that tragedy as a genre has evolved over time, what significant changes from the past do you notice in the form (not the content) of Arthur Miller's *Death of a Salesman*?
- 8. "David Lindsay-Abaire's *Rabbit Hole* is a delicate look into the lives of Becca and Howie Corbett as they navigate the unknown waters of grief following the tragic death of their only child." Discuss.
