- 1. What does Edward Said mean when he says that 'Orientalism is a discursive phenomenon, internally consistent and self-perpetuating in virtual insulation from any correspondence with a "real orient"? Why does he take the late eighteenth century as the starting point for this phenomenon?
- 2. Examine how Beckford reworks *Vathek* from an eighteenth-century oriental tale into a gothic novel.
- 3. In the Preface to the twentieth edition of *Lalla Rookh*, Thomas Moore wrote that 'the cause of tolerance was again my inspiring theme; and the spirit that had spoken in the melodies of Ireland soon found itself at home in the East'. Attempt a reading of the 'The Fire Worshippers' in the light of the above statement.
- 4. Comment on Byron's method of using the fragmented, non-chronological narrative with multiple and unidentifiable speakers in *The Giaour*. How does it influence an interpretation of the poem?
- 5. Discuss how the Brahmin speaker of William Jones' "A Hymn to Ganga" reinforces Orientalist ideas about the benevolence of British rule in India.
