(b) Whereas Amilcar Cabral's understanding of culture transcended the framing of race arguing for the class character of culture, Zoë Wicomb argues for the South Africans' dilemma to imagine culture beyond color. Keeping in mind the dialectical relation of the essays studied, comment on the limitations and nuances of imagining pan-African cultural identity.
