- **4.** What is the perception of the nation that emerges in the speeches by Nehru and Jinnah that you have read? How do they represent religion and citizenship in these speeches?

- 5. Ambedkar observes that "there is immense discontent against Parliamentary Democracy even in countries pledged to Democracy." What are the reasons for this discontent? What are the fundamental considerations that a Democracy cannot ignore?

- 7. Would you agree that in Sabitri Roy's *Harvest Song* the political is personal just as the personal is political? Discuss.
- **8.** What is the significance of the conflict between *The New Era* and *The New Muslim* in Qurratulain Hyder's *My Temples, too*? Justify your answer with a close reading of the text.
- 9. Would you agree that Sadat Hasan Manto manages to convey an uncompromising moral vision without moralising in his short stories? Answer with reference to the stories that you have read.
- **10.** Examine Ritwik Ghatak's use of space and music to represent his perception of Partition in his film *Komolgandhar*.
